to promote diverse cultures and celebrate traditions and talents from the Asian Continent.


The Festival strives to bring together people from various cultural backgrounds, to promote peace, harmony, unity and healthy lifestyle.

Knox Asian Festival History and Visitors




- Performances, food booths, culture booth, kids activities, passport program








- It was a very first Sumo show in Knoxville.




- ▶ The children who have roots in Indonesia could learn more about their culture through this festival.




- One mother shared her childhood memory with her kids through Goldfish scooping activity at Japanese tent.


